Prague Airport received the Airport Service Quality Award for 2021



Based on the evaluation by passengers, the Václav Havel Airport Prague won the Airport Service Quality Award for 2021. The International Airports Association each year awards the airports with the highest level of passenger satisfaction with the services provided. Smartwings and Eurowings have launched a code-share partnership

The Czech airline **Smartwings** and the German airline **Eurowings** from the Lufthansa group have started the **first phase of cooperation in the field of codeshare**. Smartwings is locating its code to Eurowings flights operated from Prague and back to 16 destinations, as a next step in the partnership, Eurowings will start marking flights operated by Smartwings with its codes. easyJet launches new route between Prague and Porto

easyJet is launching a **direct connection between Prague and Porto**. The company will fly between the two cities **twice a week** from **May 4**, always on Wednesdays and Saturdays. More at <u>www.prg.aero/en/</u>.

From Prague to 147 destinations worldwide

Throughout the summer season, Prague Airport will offer flights to **147 destinations**, including 25 charter flights. A total of **58 air carriers** will provide air connections with Prague. New routes, such as New York and Riyadh, will be added, while many other destinations will see increases in the number of frequencies, namely London, Madrid, and Paris. Bystřice's park of miniatures



A new museum exposition called **Bystřice's Park of Miniatures** is growing in **Bystřice nad Pernštejnem**. A copy of the Svratka Valley is gradually being created along a brook, with about twenty models of castles, monasteries and other monuments in a 1:50 scale. The miniatures do not reflect the current state of the monuments, but the period of its greatest prosperity in the 14th and 15th centuries. Retro museum to showcase Czechoslovak life in the 1970s and '80s



A new museum opening in the **second half of May** in Prague will explore the design, trends, and everyday life in the 1970s and '80s in Czechoslovakia. It will also include an exhibition on the role of dissent and communist propaganda. The goal is to present this era to the younger generation. People will be able to visit the **Retro Museum Prague** in the **Kotva department store.** Kotva's entire fourth floor, with an area of over 2,000 square meters, will display some of the almost 12,000 objects that were acquired through a national collection in 2018. World's longest Suspension footbridge in Dolní Morava



The **longest suspension footbridge** in the world **Sky Bridge 721** is to open soon in the mountain resort of Dolní Morava. The bridge between two ridges of the Králický Sněžník mountains will span the valley at a height of 95 meters and will be 721 meters long.

Třeboň Spa to build a hotel with a hundred beds for CZK 135 million



The **Třeboň spa** will build a **hotel** next to its Aurora spa with over 100 beds at the cost of over CZK 135 million. Also, the spa wants to open a **sauna world** with 54 seats next to the wellness center in November. The **53-room** hotel should be completed in March 2023, the sauna world has been under construction since last December, the costs will amount to CZK 95 million.

International Music Festival in Český Krumlov



The 31st International Music Festival in Český Krumlov which takes place from July 15 to Aug. 6 will offer 17 concerts set in 10 unique environments. The opening ceremony will take place unconventionally in the middle of the castle lake and music will also return to the Baroque theater, where Antonio Vivaldi's opera Farnace will be performed for two nights. Each year, the festival offers also concerts celebrating important musical anniversaries. This year, violinist Václav Hudeček will celebrate his life anniversary with his concerts, and the festival will also commemorate the 90th birthday of John Williams, who won several Oscars for his film music. The opening concert of the **77th Prague Spring** international music festival will be conducted by **Daniel Barenboim**, who caused a sensation when he **performed Smetana's My Country** at the festival in 2017 with the Vienna Philharmonic. This time he will lead the **West-Eastern Divan Orchestra**, an orchestra composed of musicians from Israel, Palestine and other Arab countries. The festival's final concert will be conducted by **Andris Nelsons** who will perform **Dvořák's Sixth Symphony** with the Vienna Philharmonic. May 12 – June 3, 2022. Easter Festival of Sacred Music



The **Easter Festival of Sacred Music** annually held in the city of **Brno** will be held this year **from April 10 to April 24**. It will offer **six concerts** in four different churches and **Tenebrae**, three candlelight concerts on Holly Wednesday (called Ugly Wednesday in the Czech Republic) Maundy Thursday and Good Friday. The festival dates back to 1992 and is the first festival of its kind in the Czech Republic. It responds to the constant interest of listeners in concerts of sacred music thematically connected with the liturgically significant period of Easter. ZENGA – Japanese Zen Paintings from the Kaeru-An Collection




For the first time ever, the **National Gallery Prague** will put on display part of **the Kaeru-An Collection** – or the "Collection from the Frog's Hut" – which will present **Japanese Zen painting and calligraphy from the 17**th **to the 20**th **century**. This unique collection of Zen art was donated to the National Gallery Prague in 2019 by Dutch artist and collector Felix Hess. The exhibition will open at the Salm Palace on May 27 and will run through Oct. 2. More at <u>www.ngprague.cz/en/</u>.

History at the National Museum



The **History** exhibition newly opened in the **historic building of the National Museum** captures in seven halls the past of the Czech lands **from the 8th century until the First World War**. The first halls are dedicated to the Middle Ages - the settlement of the Czech territory, the establishment of the Czech state and contacts with neighboring countries, the structure and system of medieval society, the penetration of Christianity, and also the first written materials documenting education. The early modern period, that is the period from the 15th to the 18th century, is shown in halls focusing on the Thirty Years' War and re-Catholicization. The period of the so-called long 19th century (from the 1880s to 1914) is on display in the last of the exhibition halls. More at www.nm.cz/en/.

Karel Vaňura: Layering

Czech Specials project extended to confectioneries and cafés

The Czech Specials project, joint project of the CzechTourism agency and the Association of Chefs and Confectioners of the Czech Republic, aims to popularize Czech cuisine. Czech Specials is not only a guide to quality restaurants that offer traditional and modern Czech cuisine, it is also a prestigious certification mark. As confectionery is also an integral part of Czech cuisine, the Czech Specials certification has been extended in February to include confectioner's shops and cafés. Those that offer at least three types of typically Czech high quality confectionery products made in traditional or modern way can apply for Czech Specials certification now. Restaurants and confectioneries that apply for the project and meet all the required criteria will be marked with the Czech Specials brand. The certificate is granted for a three-year period, then it is necessary to apply for a new certification.

Technical monuments of the Czech lands



Since March 9, the Czech Television has been broadcasting a documentary series called Technical Monuments of the Czech Lands. Hosted by Tomáš Hanák, the cycle, co-authored by the CzechTourism agency, presents technical monuments of all fourteen regions of the Czech Republic. Among the monuments visited are, for example, the Prague Museum of Public Transport and its historic tram No. 41, Křižík's power plant in the town of Písek, or the Handmade Paper Mill in Velké Losiny.
