The Midnightdeal accommodation platform is coming to the Czech Republic



Midnightdeal expands to the Czech Republic. Founded in 2017 in Vienna, the **booking platform** mediates accommodation through an auction model, combining the free capacity of premium hotels with travelers who do not choose their accommodation at a fixed price, but offer their own during an online auction. As a result, they can reach for much cheaper accommodation, an average of 35% compared to the cheapest rates online. Hoteliers, on the other hand, rent more rooms without much effort and at the same time retain full control over prices - they are the ones who either accept the final offer at midnight or not. Midnightdeal currently has over 500 hotel partners in approximately 20 countries. including the Czech Republic, and plans to reach 1,500 by the end of the year. Source: Midnightdeal

Eurowings is planning further expansion in Prague, adding four new lines as of the autumn

Less than a year after the opening of its new base at the Prague Airport, **Eurowings**, a subsidiary of the Lufthansa Group, is preparing for further growth in Prague. From the **beginning of the** winter flight schedule, it will add connections to four more destinations: Hurghada and Marsa Alam in Egypt, Madeira and Oslo. Connections to both Egyptian destinations will be open once a week, every Saturday. With the new Prague Visitor Pass, **Prague attracts tourists to less** visited parts of the city

The first phase of the **Prague Visitor Pass** operation was launched in June. According to representatives of Prague City Tourism and the ICT Operator involved in its development, visiting Prague will now be much easier, especially for tourists from abroad. In addition to the main tourist attractions, the card currently offers a wide range of participating places beyond the congested city center. The Prague Visitor Pass also reflects the city's new approach to tourism,

seeking to revive it after the pandemic in sustainable form. In the first phase of full operation, tourists can use the card at 57 acceptance points, such as the Prague Zoological Garden, the Vyšehrad National Cultural Monument or the Prague Planetarium, as well as for guide services or sightseeing cruises on the Vltava River. Naturally, the iconic tourist sites such as the Petřín Lookout Tower, the Old Town Hall or Prague Castle are also included. The Prague Visitor Pass offers several possible options, from 48 hours validity to a premium option valid for up to 120 hours, which offers the holder the opportunity to explore the metropolis and its interesting places much more

thoroughly. It includes transport around the city and a selection of acceptance points. The price is favorable also to children and students.

Eva Kmentová and Olbram Zoubek: Human Dignity



The sculptors Eva Kmentová (1928-1980) and Olbram Zoubek (1926-2017) can be seen as two extraordinary artistic personalities, both of whom gradually became icons of Czech and European sculpture in the **second** half of the 20th century. They were classmates from Professor Josef Wagner's

extraordinarily stimulating studio at the Academy of Arts, Architecture and Design (VŠUP) in Prague, where Czech post-war sculpture was actually revived - or reborn. They were also life partners, marrying just after graduating from the school. The exhibition on the two floors of the Museum Kampa offers clusters based on the works of both artists (with themes such as a figure, a gesture, a surface, emptiness, and their different or similar rendering by both artists), as well as moments of mutual inspiration or completely different approaches. The exhibition focuses on the period from the late 1950s to the early 1980s, exhibiting not only well-known works by both sculptors but also lesser-known works. Through Oct. 2, 2022. Dvořák Prague International Music Festival

The Dvořák Prague International Music Festival represents more than two weeks full of musical events that are special because of the dramaturgical approach to the festival's central theme and the involvement of top-class performing musicians from around the world. Each autumn, Prague's concert season is launched by a spectacular festival that bears the name of the Czech composer who is famous around the world. Since early 2008, the organizer of the Dvořák Prague Festival has been the Academy of Classical Music, which has taken Antonín Dvořák's creative legacy under its wing. Prague, various venues. Amidst Smoke Rings: Portrait of a Modern Artist

The exhibition will pursue the **motif** of an artist as a smoker from the Baroque era to the interwar period with a special focus on the art of the turn of the



19th and 20th centuries. The individual chapters will present the cigarette in the artist's hand as a symbol of a **dandy** (Anselm Feuerbach, Beneš Knüpfer), decadent (Edvard Munch, Karel Hlaváček), and symbolist creator (Jan Preisler, František Kupka). The pipe as an attribute of a painter and **poet** can be seen in Cubist paintings (Pablo Picasso Bohumil Kubišta, Emil Filla), in caricatures produced during the interwar avant-garde period (Adolf Hoffmeister), and in works by Josef Váchal. A special section will be devoted to the visualization of smoke in visual arts, to the portrait of a woman smoker (Karel Špillar, Alfons Mucha). The exhibition will also display **photography** (Josef Sudek, František Drtikol, Jaroslav Rössler) and applied arts that will adumbrate a wider context of the period smoking culture.

The exhibition seeks to present the theme in an international context by courtesy of significant foreign loans of works of Édouard Manet, Pierre Bonnard, Edvard Munch, or James Ensor from Musée d'Orsay in Paris, Munch Museum in Oslo, Kröller-Müller Museum in Otterlo and Kunsthaus in Zurich. No less importantly,

the exhibition will present the works of the National Gallery Prague as well as loans from Czech public institutions and private collectors. Sept. 24, 2022 – Jan. 8, 2023. National Gallery, Trade Fair Palace. More at www.ngprague.cz/en/

BADIUCAO: MADe IN CHINA



MADe IN CHINA is the first solo show by **Badiucao**, the pseudonym of a Chinese artist-activist known for his protest art who is currently working in exile in Australia. Badiucao has established himself on the international stage thanks to social media, through which he spreads his message all over the world, exposing himself on the front line against every form of ideological and moral control exercised by political power, constantly challenging the Chinese government and censorship in support of the transmission of a non-plagiarized historical memory. The exhibition looks back over the Badiucao's work, considering multiple aspects of his artistic production: graphic, painted and multi-material works bearing witness to the violations of human rights, the censorship inflicted on Chinese citizens on the issue of Covid-19, the repression of dissents in Myanmar during the military coup in 2021, as well as the forced cultural assimilation of the Uyghurs and including the protests that have seen the population of Hong Kong struggle to challenge the political line of the government. The seniors were represented by the captain of the National Team of Chefs and Confectioners of the AKC CR, Jan Horký. Honza prepared a four-course menu together with Magda Murínová. Honza and Magda together won seventh **place** among eighteen competitors.
