Václav Havel Airport Prague handled over 3.8 million passengers in the summer



From June to August, Prague Airport handled over 3.8 million passengers, which is less than in the record year of 2019, but the trend is increasing. From the beginning of the year to the end of August, almost seven million passengers passed through the airport. The busiest day was the first of July, when the number of checked-in passengers exceeded 50,000. More at www.prg.aero/en.

Leoš Janáček Airport had successful summer

Ostrava Airport had very successful summer months. From January to the end of August, over 212,000 passengers passed through its gates. This is an **increase of 118%** compared to the same period of last year. Due to the



covid restrictions in China and the war conflict in Ukraine, a slight 8% decrease in cargo transport was recorded at the Ostrava airport, in the first 8 months of the year, 9.4 thousand tons of cargo were transported. The very strong demand for travel was also reflected in the airport's revenues.

More tourists stayed in Czech hotels in July than in July last vear

31% more guests than last year came to hotels in the Czech Republic this **July**. Comparing the data with the same period before the covid-19 pandemic, i.e. with the first holiday month of 2019,

the number of visitors was lower by 5.7%. In absolute numbers, hotels in the Czech Republic welcomed the total of 1,413,212 guests this July, Czech visitors prevailed over foreign guests. Source: CzechTourism.

Prague

Prague City Hall and Prague City Tourism launched a project of returnable cups at selected **Prague events**

The City of Prague in cooperation with Prague City Tourism launched a project of returnable cups for events held on Prague's embankments and at the Exhibition Grounds to promote the use of sustainable utensils instead of single-use consumer plastics. The city has set aside CZK 2.4 million for the project. At the end of the project's trial phase, the system will move to fully commercial operation without municipal support. Prague City Tourism was commissioned by the city to implement the trial phase of the project and distribute the cups. The trial phase will run from September 2022 to February 2024.

Janáček Brno Festival 2022



The Janáček Brno 2022 Festival brings a dramaturgy focused on a theme that was very fundamental to the formation of Janáček's personality and work – the relationship to Slavic culture. Pan-Slavism, an idea that was already causing considerable controversy among Czech artists and intellectuals, was a major theme throughout the 19th century, and Janáček, like many intellectuals of the time, was strongly influenced by it. With its focus on Slavic culture, the Janáček Brno 2022 Festival will recall this important aspect of Janáček's thinking and understanding of cultural values. The subtitle of the festival, very relevant today,

John Wehrheim: Paradise Lost



In 1969, several hippies settled on the Hawaiian island of Kauai, where a larger community of people gradually emerged. The base consisted of young Americans from the mainland prosecuted for loitering, for whom Elizabeth Taylor's brother Howard paid bail and then invited them to his Hawaiian estate. The community grew here for eight years. It consisted of a wide spectrum of people from hippies to surfers, from free-thinking families to Vietnam veterans. In 1977, the local government decided to liquidate this utopian village and build a public park in its place. The local police set fire to the flimsy buildings and their 120 inhabitants had to face new living conditions.
